The Importance of Praying about the Conception to Birth Period:

- Conception inconvenient for parents
 1. Parents not married
 2. Baby not planned
 3. Husband not always home
 4. Couple unready for parenthood
 5. Baby given up for adoption
- Conception the result of a rape, lust, adultery
 1. One or both parents under the influence of drugs, alcohol
 2. Mother possibly a prostitute
- Baby unwanted by one or both parents
- Parents had to get married because of conception
- Mother experienced previous miscarriage or even abortion: Earlier trauma by mother invited spirit of fear in the womb
- Fear in mother during pregnancy
 1. Possible abuse to mother
 2. Possible abuse to/attempts abortion of baby in utero
- Mother's poor self-image during pregnancy
- Sickness, accident or grieving during pregnancy
- Marital discord
- Disappointment in sex of baby
- Negative, damaging words spoken over the baby in utero
- Traumatic Birth
 1. Long, hard labor
 2. Breech birth
 3. Umbilical cord wrapped around neck
 4. Delivery by instruments or premature birth
 5. Rh Blood factor problem
 6. Separated from mother and incubated at birth
- Difficulty with breast feeding/Baby not breast fed
- Potential problems with twin births
 1. Space problems in utero
 2. One twin does not survive
- Baby does not want to be born
 1. Fear resulting from one or more of the aforementioned factors.

Praying for Healing from Conception to Birth

1. Inquire delicately about the person's birth process:

Sample questions

Did he come at a good time in his parents' lives?

Were there previous miscarriages or abortions?

Was there difficulty in the pregnancy or birth itself?

Were the parents married?

Was there drug use, alcohol use in the home?

Did the parents get along?

How soon after the parents were married did the child come?

Did any close family members or friends die during this time?

Was the father at home?

Did the mother experience any illnesses at this time?

Through prayer, invite Jesus into the moment of conception.

2. Impress upon the person that before he was formed in his mother's womb, God knew him. He created this person. His one purpose is for the person to have a loving relationship with Him forever. God is the first and real parent, and He placed this person in an earthly family.

3. Pray for release from genetic problems. Cut free from generational bondage, such as alcoholism, mental instability, occult involvement, promiscuity and out of wedlock births, poverty, etc.

4. Pray to fill the womb with the power of the Holy Spirit in the form of a warm, golden oil or light, so the baby lives, moves and has his being IN God. Let the Holy Spirit be the buffer between any negative thoughts, emotions or words of the mother or father, or doctor or other significant person.

5. Ask God to reassure the person that He wanted and planned for a male or female child. This person was created on purpose by God.

6. Ask God to place within the person all the gifts, talents and tools that this person will need to become the person God created.

7. Reassure the person of God's love and of the person's uniqueness. Pray for God's presence, safety and peace as the child grows and develops.

8. Ask the person quietly and gently what he is feeling or seeing. If nothing, ask what he is thinking.

9. When getting to the delivery, ask what he is feeling, i.e. fear, anxiety, excitement. Many times, people never wanted to be born. They perceived the world as unsafe and never wanted to come forth. Ask if he is able to ask Jesus to help him choose life.

10. Ask gently if the person can see or feel the Lord. It may be through a bright light or feeling of peace. Allow time for Jesus to receive him into His hands so the first touch the person ever feels is His touch of strength, gentleness, warmth, security and safety. Allow quiet time so that hopefully the person will see or feel Jesus' presence. Let Jesus' face be the first face he ever sees, and let Jesus' voice be the first voice he ever hears.

CLUES FOR IDENTIFICATION OF IN UTERO WOUNDS

Conditions In Utero	Commonly Observed Patterns of Attitude and Behavior after Birth
A child is not wanted or parents ambivalent about wanting them	Striving, performance orientation, trying to earn the right to be, inordinate desire to please (or the opposite: rejecting before he/she can be rejected), tense, apologetic, angry, death wish, frequent illness, problems with bonding, refuses affection (or has an insatiable desire for it)
Conceived out of wedlock	Deep sense of shame, lack of belonging
Bad time financially	"I am a burden. . ."
Parents too young, not ready	"I'm an intrusion."
Poor health of mother	Guilt for being – child may take emotional responsibility for the mother
Parents wanted child of the opposite sex	Sexual identification problems (sometimes one of the causes of homosexuality), striving to be what the parents want, futility, defeatist attitude: "I was wrong from the beginning"
This conception follows miscarriage	Overserious, over achieving, striving, trying to make up for the loss, angry at being a replacement, not getting to be "me"
Mother's inordinate fear of delivery	Afraid, insecure, fearful of childbirth
Fighting in the home	Nervous, uptight, fearful, jumpy, quick to jump in to control a discussion when differences of opinion are beginning to emerge, guilty – "I'm the reason for the quarrel," parental inversion: taking emotional responsibility for the parents.
Father dies or leaves	Guilt– "My fault," anger, bitter root expectation to be abandoned, inordinate hunger to find the father, death wish, depression
Mother loses a loved one	Deep sadness, depression, death wish, fear of death, loneliness, "no support for me – I will have to depend on myself."
Unwholesome sexual relations, father's approaches to the mother are insensitive, violent, or more than one sex partner	Aversion to sex or promiscuity, fear of male organ, general unhealthy attitude
Mother is afraid of gaining too much weight, does not eat properly	Insatiable hungers, anger
Mother a heavy smoker	Predisposition to sever anxiety
Mother consumes much caffeine	Baby likely to have poor muscle tone and low activity level

Mother consumes alcohol	More than just chemical effects, the baby absorbs the negative feelings which cause the mother to drink
Breech delivery	Higher risk of having learning problems
Unusually painful delivery	Anger lacking acceptable outlet, ulcers, depression
Relatively normal delivery	Fury (if mother's or child's pain seems to confirm rejection or ambivalence in utero)
Induced labor	Can affect mother/child bonding, can result in masochistic personality or sexual perversion, anger
C-Section	Intense craving for all kinds of physical contact, trouble with concept of space, clumsiness
Corn Around Neck	Throat-related problems, swallowing, speech impediments, anti-social or criminal behavior.
